

ALL ABOUT YOU—Dan Lindsey

Dan is known for wearing a Marine Corps hat whenever not wearing his riding helmet, but he has worn many hats on his long career. He started wearing a Marine Corps uniform hat, then through the years-a service station worker, Base Club manager, Drill Instructor, OCS instructor, Recruiter, Landscaper, Concrete truck driver, Volunteer fireman and EMT. His hat of choice since retirement is a motorcycle helmet.

In 1973 after his first tour of military service, Dan moved to California and took a job at a service station. A co-worker had a 450 Chopper, and Dan's riding desire started, so he bought a CB 350 and started riding. At the end of 1973, Dan became a service station manager in training, but the Gasoline War in 1974 and shortage of gas, made Dan decide this wasn't for him, and he returned to Active Duty in the Military.

Dan started out at Camp Pendleton, then went to Okinawa, and then started his many positions in the Marine Corps. He and Shelia lived in many places during his Military career in the Marines. In 1992 Dan retired after 23 years of service. He told Shelia that she moved with him all the years of military service, so she could decide where they would live their civilian life—she chose Kentucky to be near family.

He became a Landscape Foreman and then a truck driver for a Concrete Co. But, Dan being Dan decided he wasn't doing enough for his Country, and he became a Volunteer Firemen for 7 years, and during the last 2 years became an EMT.

Dan has been an owner of various bikes-a CB 350, CB 450, 1978 Goldwing, 83 Aspencade, 87 Aspencade, his only new bike, and now has a 2006 Goldwing and a 2008 Goldwing Trike. Dan laughed when he told us about a call Shelia made to him. In 1983, she called him and told him she saw a 1978 Goldwing and thought it was a Really Nice Bike.


Being a husband, Dan asked if she was telling him to get it-She replied NO, just telling you. WELL, Dan went straight to the Honda dealer, bought the bike and rode it home. He had never ridden a Goldwing before, but had to learn overnight, because he had to take his motorcycle permit test the next day. Dan chuckles when he talks about the test—I didn't

do very well with the test, but I "Sweet Talked" the lady telling her that I had been in the service, and hadn't ridden in a long time. HE DROVE OFF WITH HIS LICENSE.

Dan stopped riding in 1989 after an accident landed him in hospital for 10 days. A semi-truck changed lanes hitting a car and that caused the car to hit Dan, demolishing the bike. However in 2009, Dan saw too many motorcycles and the desire to





Dan had a few riding memories---. #1-He had a close call on a ride to Sturgis, an antelope crossed in front of him and fell on the road, when it got up its leg hit the bike's tire, but the bike stayed up. #2—Dan invented "Motorcycle Seat Belts"- In 1989, Dan took his 13 year old daughter, Erin, on his bike, from California to visit relatives in Mississippi. She kept falling asleep and slipping off her seat. Being the Good Dad, Dan got bungee cords, wrapped them around his daughter securing her to the bike. Needless to say, He got many looks and stares as he rode down the highway. #3—He had an "Iron Butt Ride". In 1978, Dan got a call that his father had a stroke and wasn't doing well in the hospital in Memphis, Tenn. Dan couldn't get a plane for days, so at midnight Dan left Yucca Valley, California on his bike. He drove 24 hours straight stopping only for gas and pit stops, finally taking a short nap on a park bench. Well, 32 hours after he left, Dan walked into his Dad's hospital room.

Dan and Shelia moved to Ocala in 2000 to be near and take care of her Mother. In 2009, Dan heard about a motorcycle meeting, and decided to check it out. He met Jim, Joe, Frank, Big Jim, Jolene and Jack, and that started his relationship with FL1-F2. In his first year, He was "Person of the Year", and then became Assistant Chapter Director for a few years giv-

ing it up to care for Shelia.

Dan always had Shelia as his Riding Companion, until her illness made it impossible for her to ride. Dan gave up his chapter position and gave her his full attention and devotion until she passed. Shelia was his greatest cheerleader to ride and buy motorcycles. Dan has a daughter, Erin and 3 granddaughters who live in Louisville, Ky. He also had a brother, Eddie who was a GWRRA member.

Dan's Motto is—ONCE A MARINE, ALWAYS A MARINE, and if there's anything the military needs-I'm there.

Dan says motorcycle riding is his RELAXATION & ESCAPE


